The Arabian oryx, also called the white oryx, was extinct in the wild as of 1972, but was reintroduced to the wild starting in 1982. Initial reintroduction was primarily from two herds: the "World Herd" originally started at the Phoenix Zoo in 1963 from only nine oryx and the Saudi Arabian herd started in 1986 from private collections and some "World Herd" stock by the Saudi National Wildlife Research Center. As of 2009 there have been reintroductions in Oman, Saudi Arabia, Israel, the United Ar

In 1962, some Arabian oryx were taken from the wild and were brought to the U.S. These animals served as the foundation of an international breeding effort and for reintroductions into the wild in Oman in 1982, Jordan in 1983, and central Saudi Arabia in 1990.

The Arabian oryx was extinct in the wild by the early 1970s, but was saved in zoos and private preserves, and was reintroduced into the wild starting in 1980. In 1972 the last known animal was shot and the species was made extinct in the wild. In the 1990s the reintroduction of herds was a success and now poaching has again become a serious threat that has devastated the population in Oman. Population number. According to the IUCN Red List, the total Arabian oryx population size is around 1,000 individuals.

Some of the animals raised in Qatar have been reintroduced into the wild in the region, none, as yet, in Qatar itself. Saudi Arabia and Oman have similar captive breeding programmes and now have wild populations of Arabian oryx.

An Arabian Oryx "World Herd" was established at Phoenix Zoo, USA, made up of three animals live-caught by the Fauna and Flora Preservation Society in Yemen in 1962, four animals presented by HM King Saud of Saudi Arabia, one donated by H.H. Sheikh Jaber Abdullah Al Sabah of Kuwait and one donated by London Zoo.

How the Arabian oryx was brought back from extinction ...

By the 1970s the Arabian Oryx was extinct in the wild in the whole Arabian Peninsula. Some of the last animals were captured to for a 'world herd' with animals from the royal collections from Abu Dhabi, Qatar and Saudi Arabia. This herd provided the stock which is used for reintroduction programs all over the Arabian Peninsula, including Jordan.

The return of the Arabian oryx Oryx leucoryx to Oman symbolized the success of a new approach to species conservation and established reintroduction as a conservation tool. Ten years after the species had been exterminated in the wild by poaching, the first 10 founder oryx, descendants of the 'World Herd', were reintroduced to the desert in central Oman in January 1982.
