### Anticipation Guide - Comprehension Strategies

An anticipation guide is a specific prediction, or pre-reading, strategy that asks students to provide an opinion about big ideas or themes that are present in the text (Beers, 2003). After reading, students return to the same statements and identify whether they agree or disagree with that statement.

Definition/Description: An anticipation guide is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and get students excited and curious about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to the teacher or another student state key ideas about the concepts in the text. They can also read several statements about the key concepts presented in the text.

### Anticipation Guide - STRATEGIES

Predicting Predicting is an important reading strategy. It allows students to use information from the text, such as titles, headings, pictures and diagrams to anticipate what will happen in the story (Bailey, 2015). When making predictions, students envision what will come next in the text, based on their prior knowledge.

### Predicting - Reading Strategies & Misconceptions

Anticipation/Reaction Guide. An Anticipation/Reaction Guide utilizes a twin strategy to increase reading comprehension: stimulate prior knowledge and experiences before reading and then reinforce key concepts after reading. The guide presents students with a series of leading questions to be answered in writing before reading.

Purpose of teaching Anticipation Guides: Anticipation Guides (Herber, 1978) are typically a list of statements related to a topic that act as scaffolding for student understanding of the text. Students indicate if they agree or disagree with each of the statements.

Prior to reading, students read a list of statements about a given topic and begin to make connections with a text they will soon read.
