Apa Style Guide Title Page

APA provides a student title page guide (PDF, 199KB) to assist students in creating their title pages. Student Title Page The student title page includes the paper title, author names (the byline), author affiliation, course number and name for which the paper is being submitted, instructor name, assignment due date, and page number, as shown in the following example.

Title Page Setup - APA Style

Basic Format The page header on your title page should read, "Running Head: TITLE OF YOUR PAPER" The running head should be in the upper left-hand corner of the paper, and the page numbers should be in the upper...

Title Page - APA Style Guide - Library at American ...

The recommended length for a title is up to 12 words. The title should be positioned in the upper half of the page and centered. The title should be typed in 12-point Times font. Do not bold, underline, or italicize the title. Also include a running header (a short title of your paper) on the title page. Type as: 'Running head: TITLE IN ALL CAPS.'

TITLE PAGE: The title page needs to provide information about the paper's topic and authors and the course to which it is being submitted. Title Page Content. Student Title Page Guide, APA Style 7th Edition

For a student title page, the page header consists of just a page number in the top-right corner. There is no need for a running head (as was the case in APA 6th edition). A professional title page does have a running head. The running head is an abbreviated version of the paper title in all capital letters.

The title page includes the following elements: Page number, Paper title, Author, Author Affiliation, Course, Instructor, and Due Date. Remember, your instructor can include other requirements for your assignment. Refer to their instructions carefully. Your title page and paper is double-spaced.

Title Page Setup. Title Page Elements • The affiliation consists of the department of the course and the name of the university. • Write the course number and name and instructor name as shown on course materials. • Use the date format used in your country for the assignment due date. • Page number 1 appears in the top right of the page in the page header.

APA recommends that your title be focused and succinct and that it should not contain abbreviations or words that serve no purpose. Your title may take up one or two lines. All text on the title page, and throughout your paper, should be double-spaced. Beneath the title, type the author's name: first name, middle initial (s), and last name.

Type your title in upper and lowercase letters centered in the upper half of the page. APA recommends that your title be no more than 12 words in length and that it should not contain abbreviations or words that serve no purpose. Your title may take up one or two lines. All text on the title page, and throughout your paper, should be double-spaced.

If no directions are given, students may use the APA-specified title page for students, which includes: the title of the paper, the name of each author of the paper, the affiliation for each author (typically the school being attended),

The reference page is double spaced. The title, "References," is centered. The reference page may have any of the following titles, depending the requirements laid out by instructors: "References," "Works Cited," or "Bibliography." All sources listed in the reference list have been used at least once in the paper.

Reference Page - APA Style Guide - Library at American ...

The body of your paper will follow the title page and abstract. Title (2.4): The first few paragraphs of your paper will be an introduction. Begin them with the title, centered and bolded (not the word "Introduction").

APA Changes 6th Edition // Purdue Writing Lab

Italicize titles of journals, magazines and newspapers. Do not italicize or use quotation marks for the titles of articles. Capitalize only the first letter of the first word of the article title. If there is a colon in the article title, also capitalize the first letter of the first word after the colon.

Journal Articles - APA Style (7th Edition) Citation Guide ...

The title of the paper on the first page of the paper should be bold, centered, and in title case on the first line of the page. (2.11) The title of "Author Note" (2.3), "Abstract" (2.9/2.28), "References," (2.12/2.28) are in bold, centered, and in title case.
