Children with spina bifida higher on the spine (near the head) might have paralyzed legs and use wheelchairs. Those with spina bifida lower on the spine (near the hips) might have more use of their legs and use crutches, braces, or walkers, or they might be able to walk without these devices.

A baby with this type of spina bifida usually has some paralysis, and muscle or bone problems as a result of the paralysis. This is due to the abnormal development of nerves in the spine, or to nerves being stretched as a result of the defect.

Parents of a child with spina bifida are at an increased risk of having a second child with a NTDs. Certain medical conditions in

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pregnant women, like diabetes, are associated with increased risk of having babies born with them. Some medications also increase the risk of NTDs when taken during pregnancy.

A child with spina bifida should engage in physical activity three to four times a week, for a period of twenty to thirty minutes per session. Of course, you should always speak to your child's physician and physical therapist about the physical activity that best meets your child's individual needs and capabilities.

Spina bifida occulta is when a baby's backbone (spine) does not fully form during pregnancy. The baby is born with a small gap in the bones of the spine. Spina bifida occulta is common and happens in about 1 out of 10 people. Usually, spina bifida occulta causes no health problems.
