CTFA M-3 Method Summary. Once it has been determined that products are free from harmful microorganisms, it is important to ensure that they remain free from contamination during manufacturing consumer use. That is accomplished through challenge testing the formula with known microorganisms to verify that if the products become contaminated, the preservative system is sufficient to inhibit the growth of the microorganisms and spoilage.
