Assessment And Treatment of EF Dysfunction. While it is theoretically not possible to improve intellect, it is possible to assess and develop executive functioning skills. Improving

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executive functioning skills is consistently correlated with increased academic and vocational success, reduction of negative symptoms (anxiety and depression), and increases in self-esteem and confidence.

Assessment and Development of Executive Function (EF ...

BACKGROUND: Executive functioning (EF) is a multifaceted neuropsychological construct that can be defined as (1) forming, (2) maintaining, and (3) shifting mental sets, corresponding to the abilities to (1) reason and generate goals and plans, (2) maintain focus and motivation to follow through with goals and plans, and (3) flexibly alter goals and plans in response to changing contingencies.

Executive functioning is a term
psychologists use to describe the many
tasks our brains perform that are
necessary to think, act, and solve

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problems. Executive functioning includes tasks that help us learn new information, remember and retrieve the information we've learned in the past, and use this information to solve problems of everyday life.

Practice Makes Perfect for Executive Functioning

The Delis-Kaplan Executive Function Systems (D-KEFS; Delis, Kaplan, & Karner, 2001), which is used by neuropsychologists to assess EFs, is an example of a sub-skill assessment, and includes tests of specific skills such as inhibition and mental flexibility.
