In order for students to be able to self-assess their fluency using this rubric, they need to “hear” themselves as readers. Rather than asking students to read-aloud, listen to themselves, and then self-assess, I think it’s much more effective to teach students to record their thinking, play it back, and then self-assess.

Fluency Practice Passages Improve reading speed and accuracy with repeated readings of Fluency Practice Passages. Students orally read passages designed for one-minute readings several times with appropriate expression and smoothness to increase reading rate, resulting in improved focus on comprehension.

Precision Teaching in its purest form require PT practitioners make use of the Standard Celeration Chart, a logarithmic graph, to display fluency data. Our Service uses a much simpler recording chart to measure responses as we do not use techniques that focus upon speed, etc.
