

Guide To Cushion Smocking

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To do smocking, start by making a grid on a piece of fabric using small, evenly-spaced dots. Then, thread a needle and make a small stitch under the first dot, from one side of the dot to the other. Then, bring the stitch to the next dot and repeat.

You need atleast 3 times the cloth for the width of the final piece. ie if you want a final smocked piece of 10 inches you need to take 30 inches cloth to do the smocking. But then it also depends on the tightness of the smocking stitches. If you make very slack stitches the cloth needed will be less.

The easiest way is to prepare your fabric is using rows of long straight machine stitches. Sew several parallel rows of stitches then pull up the

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threads on the underside to create the bank of tucks. Having gathered up your fabric, secure the ends to control the tucks while you sew.

Make Smocking Cushion

To get 40 cm of the smocked material we need $40 \times 2 \div 2.8 = 28.5$ squares or 28 full squares. Material needed for 28 squares is $28 \times 2 \text{ cm} = 56 \text{ cm}$. Add 2 cm for the seams on both sides. Length of material needed = $56 \text{ cm} + 4 \text{ cm} = 60 \text{ cm}$. Let us check .If we smock 28 squares we get $14 \times 2.8 \text{ cm} = 39.2 \text{ cm}$.

Bring needle through fabric on left side of first pleat to be stitched--approximately 1/3 the way down from the top of the pleat. 3. With thread down below needle, "pick up" top 1/3 of the next pleat (it's important that needle is inserted in the next pleat). Now, pull the 2 pleats firmly together.

Creative Keepsakes - Beginner's Guide

This is a traditional smocking plate. The basic design is for 20 rows. As with most English smocking patterns, the only diagram is the front photo- all instructions are written only. The plate was published in 1977, and has been saved in a plastic sleeve and has never been used. For smocking plates, you only pay shipping for the first plate.
