Weak and inequitable health systems--especially those that are confronted by severe human resources shortages or lack means for sustainable financing--represent a key obstacle to scaling up the disease prevention and control programmes required to meet the health objectives outlined in the Goals: reducing child and maternal mortality and the burden of HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria and providing access to affordable essential drugs in developing countries.

Drivers of Health Care Spending in the U.S. Prohibitively high cost is the primary reason Americans give for problems accessing health care. Americans with below-average incomes are much more likely than their counterparts in other countries to report not: visiting a physician when sick; getting a recommended test, treatment, or follow-up care; filling a prescription; and seeing a dentist.
