Getting Started. The ability to recognize inference is an important critical thinking skill essential to reading comprehension. Teachers should explicitly teach students the definitions, components, and examples of inferencing and drawing conclusions, from a text (see attached example comics).

5 Activities, Lessons, and Ideas for Teaching Inferring in ...

Play a game in which students make inferences about one another. Try having each student stand in front of the classroom for 2-3 minutes while their peers infer things about the student. For example, students may say, "She's wearing a sweater, which means she's cold," or "He's wearing glasses so he must have bad eyesight."
