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Ocular Inflammatory Disease And Uveitis

Uveitis is a wide range of inflammatory diseases of the eye, specifically the uvea. There are 3 basic layers of the eye - the sclera and cornea on the outside, the retina on the inside, and the uvea in between. The uvea is comprised mostly of blood vessels and connective tissue, including pigmented cells. The different parts of the uvea are the iris in the front, the ciliary body in the middle, and the choroid located behind these, which lies around most of the eye.

Uveitis may be caused by problems or diseases occurring in the eye or it can

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be part of an inflammatory disease affecting other parts of the body. It can happen at all ages and primarily affects people between 20-60 years old. Uveitis can last for a short (acute) or a long (chronic) time. The severest forms of uveitis reoccur many times. Eye care professionals may describe the disease more specifically as: Anterior uveitis; Intermediate uveitis; Posterior uveitis; Panuveitis uveitis

Uveitis has many potential causes, including infections by virus, fungus, bacteria, or parasites. It may be

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associated with systemic inflammatory diseases (those that affect the whole body), or can develop after an injury to the eye. In a large number of cases, the cause of uveitis is not known.

Ocular inflammation occurs in approximately 4% to 6% of patients with IBD. 49, 64, 67-69 The ocular manifestations of this disease include anterior uveitis, scleritis and, occasionally, keratitis. The most common ocular manifestation is anterior uveitis and most often presents as a nongranulomatous, recurrent AAU.

The sclera is the white part of the eye. When the sclera is swollen, red, tender, or painful (called inflammation), it is called scleritis. It is common for people with scleritis to have another disease, like rheumatoid arthritis or other autoimmune disease. This underlying disease causes many of the symptoms of scleritis.

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
