Friends, Family, and Enemies of Julius Caesar

Each of them had friend among nobles and highly developed clientele (in client relationships with them were whole cities - both in Italy and in the provinces). The triumvirate was strengthened through dynastic marriages. Pompey married Caesar's daughter Julia, Caesar married Calpurnia, which was daughter of one prominent triumvirate supporter.
