Negative reinforcement is a term described by B. F. Skinner in his theory of operant conditioning. In negative reinforcement, a response or behavior is strengthened by stopping, removing, or avoiding a negative outcome or aversive stimulus.

Finding balance between positive and negative consequences. Clients often ask us to define the desired balance between positive and negative consequences when shaping or sustaining behavior. Research on the words we use supports using a minimum ratio of four positive comments to one negative comment (a 4:1 ratio), but there is more to it than that.

What is positive discipline and negative discipline ...

A simple way to remember the difference is that positive consequences are more proactive and negative consequences are more reactive. In other words, positive consequences are designed to encourage kids to repeat good behaviors while negative consequences are given in response to a behavior you want your child to change.

Positive Behavior Management Strategies for the Primary ...

Positive discipline is where only positive issues/ behavior are considered with the purpose of stimulating these issues. It is like keep highlighting the complements and rewards for positive behavior. Negative discipline when the focus is only on negative behavior and keep talking about punishment and penalties.

Discipline Kids With Positive and Negative Consequences

The terms behavior management and behavior modification are seldom used any more. As we have learned about the communicative function of behavior, "positive behavioral supports" has come into use as the preferred terminology and model of behavioral support.

Examples of Positive and Negative Reinforcement and Punishment

Positive Reinforcement Negative Reinforcement; Positive Reinforcement is a concept of Operant conditioning that presents favorable reinforcer, so that the subject repeats its behavior.: Negative Reinforcement is the concept of Operant conditioning that presents certain reinforcers, which increases the behavior of the subject in order to avoid those reinforcers.

4:1 Ratio

Positive punishment is an attempt to influence behavior by adding something unpleasant, while negative reinforcement is an attempt to influence behavior by taking away something unpleasant. Both methods are employed to influence behavior, but positive punishment looks to remove or decrease a "bad" behavior while negative reinforcement seeks to encourage or increase a "good" behavior.
