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Rural and Other Medically Underserved Populations, An ...

Rural and underserved communities face significant challenges accessing health care services. In many areas, the supply of health care providers cannot keep up with the demand for services. The shortage or inadequate distribution of the health care workforce can create barriers to accessing timely and appropriate care, lead to negative health status and create significant costs for states.

Improving Access to Care in Rural and Underserved ...

Medically underserved patients in rural areas are more vulnerable to poor health outcomes, including the risks associated with coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). Pharmacists, student pharmacists, and other health care professionals are working together to implement new, innovative ways to deliver the same standard of care during the COVID-19 pandemic to these vulnerable patients.

Pharmacist-Led Chronic Care Management for Medically ...

Possible factors contributing to the reduced number of healthcare professionals in rural and urban underserved areas include demanding working conditions, substandard medical equipment and facilities, inadequate financial remuneration, inadequate opportunities for personal and professional development, safety concerns, and lack of job opportunities for spouse and educational opportunities for children (Lehmann 2008).

Interventions for increasing the proportion of health ...

Medically Underserved Areas (MUAs) may be a whole county or a group of contiguous counties, a group of county or civil divisions or a group of urban census tracts in which residents have a shortage of personal health services.

Some entities that do business in rural or underserved counties are exempt from certain regulatory requirements of the Truth in Lending Act.
