In addition to the assays cited by IARC in Tables 4.1-4.6,

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additional studies are discussed in the narrative of the IARC Monograph 112 in Sects. 4.2.2–4.2.4. These studies are related to mechanisms of genotoxicity other than those listed in the core tables. The majority of these studies explore sex hormone disruption and oxidative stress.

How did the US EPA and IARC reach diametrically opposed ...

Specifically, the IARC Working Group concluded that there was limited evidence in humans that night shift work causes breast, prostate, and colorectal cancer in this latest evaluation. 1 It is intriguing that the progression of breast, prostate, and colorectal cancer are each influenced by sex hormones. 2

The third monograph, on post-menopausal oestrogen therapy,

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considers evidence of an association with cancer at eight sites. Findings from a large number of epidemiological studies indicate a small increase in the risk of breast cancer in women who have used these preparations for five years or more.
