Examples of differences in Consanguinity & Affinity standards: Ohio When assessing a judge's relationship between parties, Ohio looks to three degrees of consanguinity (Ohio Code of Judicial Conduct Canon 2 Rule 2.11); however, lawyers can challenge a juror for cause with up to four degrees of consanguinity (Ohio Revised Code 2313.17).
