According to this folk concept, the direct cause of an intentional action is the mental state of intention. For an intention to be ascribed, a desire (for an outcome) and a belief (about the action-outcome link) must be present. For an action to be seen as performed intentionally, however, skill and awareness have to be present as well.
