US History Unit Number 3 Revolution and Constitution

Georgia was younger than the other colonies and still received support from the king. Many Georgians still had family in Great Britain. Anger toward the Intolerable Acts finally caused Georgia to join the revolution. About 1/3 of Georgians were Loyalists. Georgia did not allow slaves to fight. Eleven battles were fought in Georgia.

Unit 3 Revolution in Georgia

By July 1776 in Georgia, Royal Governor James Wright had been ousted from power and the colony was under the rule of the Patriots. Three Georgians, Button Gwinnett, Lyman Hall, and George Walton, attended the Second Continental Congress and signed the Declaration of Independence on behalf of the Georgia colony.
