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The Financial Cost of Healthcare Regulatory Compliance As the AHA outlines in the report, the healthcare industry spends about \$39 billion annually on the administrative facets of regulatory compliance. For the average-sized community hospital with 161 beds, that amounts to about \$7.6 million in administrative costs per year.

The True Cost of Healthcare Regulatory Compliance ...

Health systems, hospitals and PAC providers spend nearly \$39 billion each year on the administrative activities related to regulatory compliance. This translates into nearly \$7.6 million annually for an average-sized community hospital (161 beds) and rises to \$9 million for hospitals with PAC beds.

Institute of Medicine 2006 Valuing Health for Regulatory

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- Compares costs and benefits of an intervention. – Standardizes all costs and benefits in monetary terms.
- Lists all costs and benefits over time: – Can have different time lines for costs and benefits. – Can include non-health benefits.
