Gender-based violence (GBV) or violence against women and girls (VAWG), is a global pandemic that affects 1 in 3 women in their lifetime. The numbers are staggering: 35% of women worldwide have experienced either physical and/or sexual intimate partner violence or non-partner sexual violence.

Gender-Based Violence (Violence Against Women and Girls)

1 in 4 women and 1 in 9 men experience severe intimate partner physical violence, intimate partner contact sexual violence, and/or intimate partner stalking with impacts such as injury, fearfulness, post-traumatic stress disorder, use of victim services, contraction of sexually transmitted diseases, etc. 2

Violence of women against men in relationships is often trivialized due to women, on average, being physically weaker than men; in such cases, the use of dangerous objects and weapons is omitted. Research since the 1990s has identified issues of perceived and actual bias when police are involved, with the male victim being negated even while injured.

the United States are disturbing. 1 in 3 women and 1 in 10 men will experience domestic violence in their lifetime. Each year, domestic violence is estimated to affect 10 million people in the United States.. Yet for Black women, the numbers are even more stark.

Black Women & Domestic Violence

Most men are not violent, and we also have plenty of examples of women committing atrocious crimes. Nevertheless, a clear sex difference has been documented cross-culturally in the way men and women display aggression. Men are far more likely to express their aggression directly: through physical violence or verbal abuse.

One of the consequences of the animosity against male victims of domestic violence is that there are many male victims who don't even report it

and often don't tell anybody. The underreporting of female violence is a result of abused men developing a reasonable fear that they will be ridiculed and experience shame and embarrassment.
